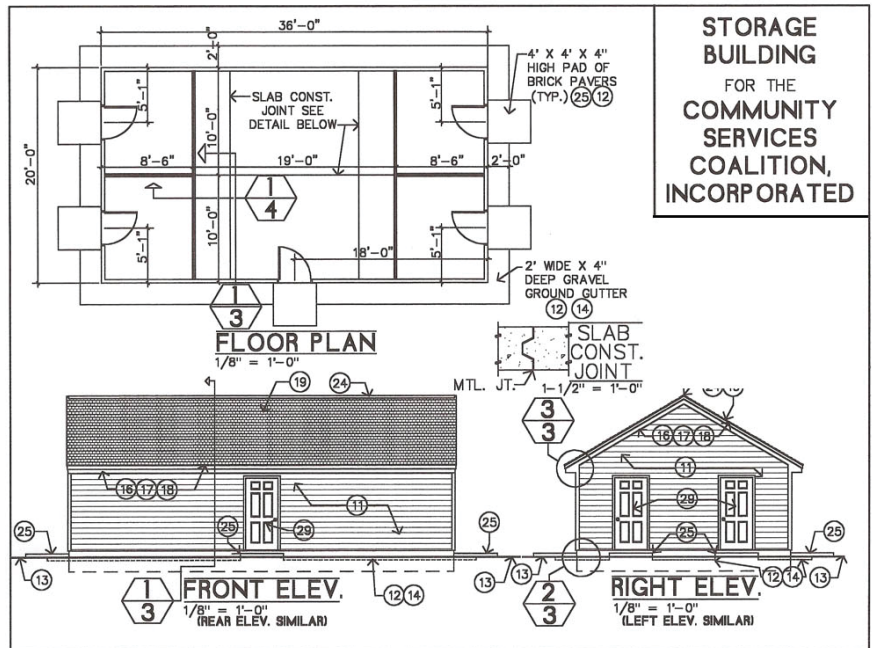

Today's Speaker: Dr. James C. Windsor

Dr. James C. Windsor, who served in the U.S. Marine Corps during the Korean War, will speak to us today about that conflict from a Marine's perspective. He received the Naval Commendation with Combat "V" for participating in the rescue of a tank and its crew from behind enemy lines and the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat.

He earned his bachelor's degree at the College of William & Mary, a master's degree in divinity at Colgate Rochester, a master of science at VCU, his doctorate at the University of Virginia and an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Christopher Newport University, where he is a professor of psychology (emeritus). He also served as president of the institution from 1970 to 1980 when it was known as Christopher Newport College.

He serves on numerous boards and commissions, including the Sarah Bonwell Hudgins Foundation (chairman), Department of Rehabilitative Services (chairman), and the Department of Mental Health Advisory Council, Secretary of Human Resources, Commonwealth of VA (chairman).

Dr. Windsor has received many awards, including the Distinguished Service Award, National Association of Mental Health and the Distinguished Service Medallion from CNC.

“Shred-A-Thon” on May 3 To Draw Attention to Identity Fraud

The Rita Welsh Adult Literacy Program and the James City County Police Department will sponsor a Shred-A Thon on Saturday, May 3, in the parking lot of the Outlet Mall in James City County, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. to draw attention to identity theft and credit card fraud. More than 9.3 million U.S. citizens were victims of identity theft and suffered almost \$50 billion fraud in 2006—and it just keeps growing.

Shred-It, an international mobile shredding company, will bring a truck to the site for on-site destruction of documents. Individuals and small businesses may bring documents containing personal data to the site for shredding. Such items as ATM receipts, bank and brokerage statements, cancelled or voided checks, expired licenses or passports, pre-approved credit card applications and more are appropriate for shredding.
